On the blog, your child can tell us what they have been learning at home. They can also ask questions if they need some help with any of the activities they have been directed to complete.


To find the class blog, please ask your child to follow the directions below:

Log into your Purple Mash account - remember the website for Purple Mash is




Now you can write your own message.
